The work of the team was commended by the judges, "A specialist team providing world-class care for people with malignant melanoma of the eye."

news in Merseyside and Cheshire Congratulations to Alder Hey's Mr Paul Farrelly on winning the prestigious Ronald Raven Prize at the British Association of Surgical Oncology (BASO) Meeting held at The Royal College of Surgeons in November 2011.

The presentation was entitled - "Does Aggressive Surgical Resection Improve Survival for Stage III and IV Neuroblastoma? - A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis" - Authors - PJ Farrelly, D Mullassery and PD Losty. In July 2011 Dhanya Mullassery won the Peter Paul Rickham Prize at The British Association of Paediatric Surgeons International Congress.

NCRI Conference comes back to Liverpool

November saw the return of the NCRI conference to the BT Convention Centre in Liverpool. The Centre

was well represented again this year including, Prof Andy Pettitt in the Clinical Trials Showcase for the CLL206 Trial, Prof John Neoptolemos highlighting the ESPAC-3 trial in the proffered paper session, Prof John Ellershaw hosted a session on *Prognastication in advanced cancer: How and why?*, and Richard Shaw co-hosted a Head and Neck Cancer Research Workshop. In addition, there were numerous posters from research groups across the Institute. George Nikolaidis took part in the teenagers cancer workshop. The NCRI Conference will be held in Liverpool again in 2012, from Nov 4—7.



Screening for Shoppers in Bootle

As part of Head and Neck Cancer Awareness Week, Professor Simon Rogers and the Head and Neck team from Aintree University Hospital screened more than 200 people for oral cancer at Bootle Strand shopping centre in November. The team were offering simple oral examinations which can detect symptoms of the disease which affects over 5,500 people each year. Professor Simon Rogers, Clinical Director for the Head and Neck Unit at Aintree University Hospital, said: "Mouth cancer is on the increase, especially in the 40 to 50 year age group, yet there is still a real lack of awareness around it."

Professor Rogers added: "Cutting out cigarettes and reducing alcohol intake can help reduce the chances of getting mouth cancer. Early detection is key and gives patients the best chance of effective treatment."

Symptoms to look out for include a persistent mouth ulcer that lasts for more than three weeks, a white or red patch in your mouth that lasts for more than three weeks or oral swelling, such as painless lumps and bumps in the mouth or neck, that have been there for more than three weeks.
